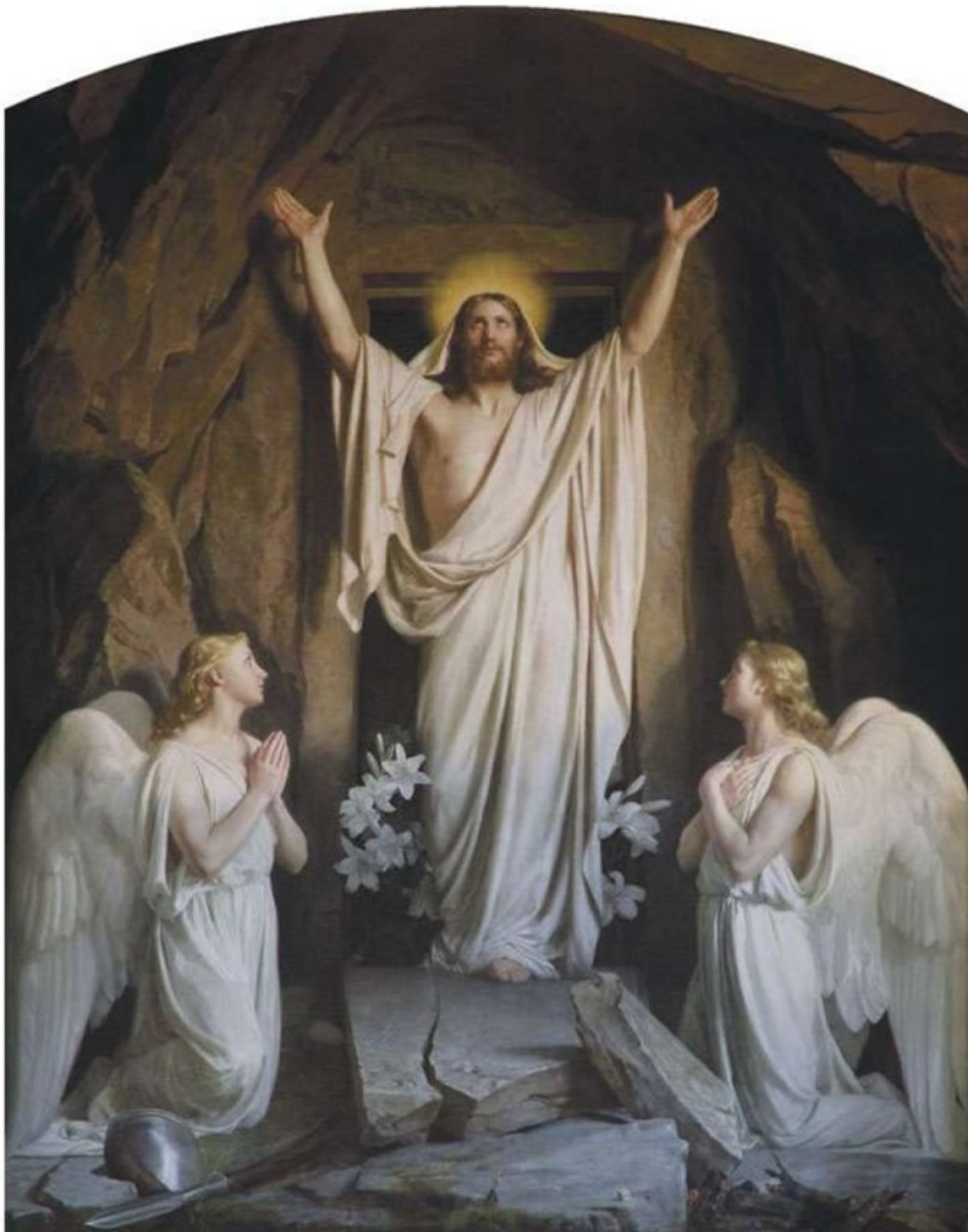

Notes from Fr. Anthony

Christus surrexit!

Christ is risen! On this beautiful Easter Holy day all of us here at St. Isidore and Holy Family pray for you all to receive the blessings and peace that the risen Lord brings to those who put their faith and trust in Him. It is a thought worth contemplating, how our good Lord even went through the gates of death in order for us to not have to be afraid. He died and rose again for us to show us that He is truly the Master and Lord of all things and that nothing is beyond His power or reach. Through His horrible suffering and bitter passion, He makes clear to us the real consequences of sin and evil. He shows us in a very visible way what the devil, through his temptations, is trying to do to the human soul by bearing out those marks of scourging and torture on His body. He made visible the unseen reality and gave us an image to contemplate of what sin really does, in all its ugliness and horror. The innocent lamb and perfect paschal sacrifice offered to His beloved Father all the pain and suffering for us. Imagine if we really truly appreciated that great love more fully on a regular basis!

As Archbishop Sheen once wrote: *“Unless there is a Good Friday in our lives there will never be an Easter Sunday. The Cross is the condition of the empty tomb, and the crown of thorns is the preface to the halo of light.”* Our Lord Jesus Christ has given us hope and reminded us of the literally undying love of God, that even the betrayal and crucifixion on Calvary could not stop God from loving us, as

He burst forth from that tomb on Easter morning to show us that even death did not have the power to stop Him from loving us. He died and rose again for us. To increase our hope in the face of trials and sufferings, to remove the grip of fear that death had upon us. To show us in a very real way that he would never leave us behind and would not allow sin and death to have the last word. He, the light of the world that the darkness could not overcome, shines forth in the darkness of our world reminding us we are never alone and that if we ever feel lost or worried or anxious, we have but to look up and we will find Him close by us.

That is how much He loves us and what this glorious Easter day means for us.

Whenever we feel troubled or anxious in this world, let us remember the words of St. Paul from 1 Corinthians 15, 54-58: **“And when this which is corruptible clothes itself with incorruptibility and this which is mortal clothes itself with immortality, then the word that is written shall come about: “Death is swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?”** The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, my beloved brothers, be firm, steadfast, always fully devoted to the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.”

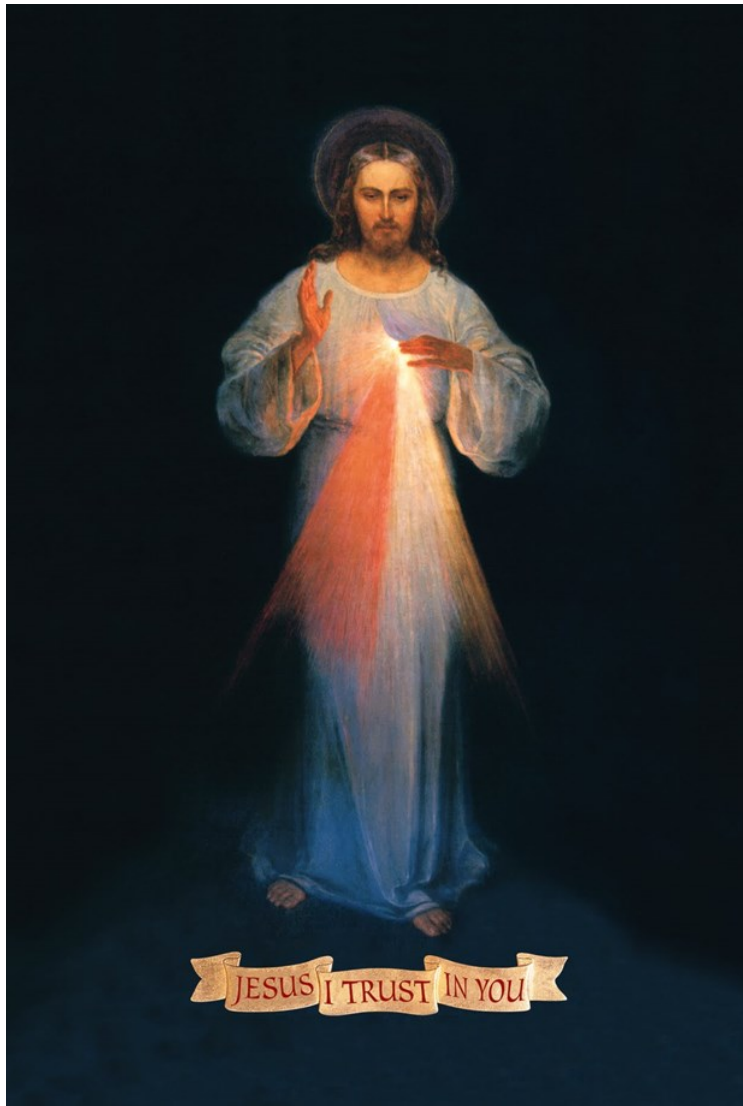

Divine Mercy Sunday Devotions

April 7th at St. Isidore from 2:00-3:00 pm



On Divine Mercy Sunday, which falls next weekend, we will have our devotions to the Divine Mercy at St. Isidore again this year. The devotions will last from 2:00-3:00 pm and will include - Eucharistic adoration, readings from some of the diary texts of St. Faustina concerning the Divine Mercy, the chaplet of Divine Mercy and the final day of the Divine Mercy novena. We will also have confessions and there will be 2 extra priests who will come to assist with making that possible for all who wish to take part in the sacrament. It is a day when we can receive a plenary indulgence if we go to confession within three weeks, receive Holy Communion and pray for the Holy Father. Please come and pray with us to honor and beg for the Divine Mercy of Our Lord, especially praying for peace and a return to God for our country, our world and all our family members and friends who have fallen away from Him.

As Jesus said to St. Faustina: *“Souls who spread the honor of My mercy I shield through their entire lives as a tender mother her infant, and at the hour of death I will not be a Judge for them, but the Merciful Savior. At that last hour, a soul has nothing with which to defend itself except My mercy. Happy is the soul that during its lifetime immersed itself in the Fountain of Mercy, because justice will have no hold on it.”*
