


# Notes from Fr. Anthony ...

A few weeks ago, we were informed that the company that up until now printed our bulletins was going out of business and they informed us that they placed many other accounts of parishes with other businesses, but that alas, ours did not make the cut. So we were left holding the proverbial bag and attempting to figure out how to move forward. Thankfully Sharon was willing to take on more work and suggested that we could do the bulletin at the parish level. And here we are. I ask everyone to please be patient as there will be changes in the way the bulletin looks and some mistakes here and there while we try to craft something that fits our needs and desires. With that being said, I think it also will be nice that it will be more personal, I guess you would say.

This week I would ask that we take a moment and give a deep look at our religious and spiritual lives. As we know, Lent is a time for penance. To turn away from sin and vice and turn back to God and truth. In reality, what has changed about our spiritual lives during Lent? Have we made and effort to get to confession or are we planning to do so in the near future? Are we spending more time in prayer as a family and a parish? Are we taking part in the Lenten devotions – in particular Stations of the Cross – and the Holy Mass? One of the most confusing things I find about us as people in general is that we all seem to have a desire to get to heaven – which is good: we want to spend eternity with God after we die – which would be ideal: yet we have such a difficult time spending time with Him here and now. There is always something else that seems to come up that pushes God and the sacraments and prayer off to the side. When we think about the fact that over the years and even in our own day, there are people who are literally putting their lives on the line to practice their faith. There have been millions over the years who did die for that, we call them martyrs. We seem to honor and respect them, however we have a much harder time desiring to imitate them in their commitment.

We will let many things get in the way of that time with God. Sometimes it is things that are unavoidable: illness, a necessity to be at one's job, taking care of someone and so on, but even in those times we could find a little time to spend with the God. Sometimes it is things that we could do something about: sports, relaxation, carelessness, intentionally working more than I really need and so on. Let's take for instance the Stations of the Cross on Friday – is that extra half an hour in the evening that difficult for me to give up for God? All those things – sports, rest, work etc. can be good, but they can't get us to heaven. They are additions to our lives, not the purpose or goal. There is time for all those things that are important *in addition* to the time *I need* for my God and perfecting my faith. At the end of it all, it boils down to the same temptation that the devil has used from the beginning. To only think about me, now. As if God would not have our best interests and ultimate good at heart. If we are being honest with ourselves, as we look around at this world and sometimes our own lives we can see how incredibly unhappy and anxious we can be. We see a world that is fearful and grasping at anything to try and get through it all except for the one thing that can get them through it -FAITH. It is faith that binds us to God. It is faith that helps us to build our house on solid ground where it will weather the storms and tempests. It is faith that keeps us focused on the light and not be swallowed up by the darkness. It is faith that allows us to use the things of this passing world properly, to be in the world but not of the world, to enjoy the good temporal things but not become mastered by them. It is faith that reminds me while life is short, eternity is forever and I have been invited by God to an eternity with Him. It is faith that allows me to respond to God's invitation. Lord, increase my faith!

#### MYSTERIES OF THE ROSARY

They paraded Our Lord through the Via Dolorosa as a public spectacle. Our Lord takes our sin and shame upon His shoulders and he carries it up Calvary's hill. Jesus calls us into His very life and saving act through an invitation to take our crosses and unite them to His. Sacrificial love is the currency to save souls.
