SAINT OF THE MONTH - OUR LADY OF FATIMA—Feast Day May 13

There were a total of (6) apparitions of Our Lady. There is a theme for each appearance. It is always to say the rosary.

During the first apparition, May 13th, 1917, Our Lady did not reveal herself to the (3) children. She only revealed that she was from Heaven. Her first request, in praying the rosary, "recite the rosary every day to obtain the peace for the world and the end of the war".

The second apparition, June 13th, 1917, Our Lady still did not reveal herself to the (3) children. Again, she asked the (3) to continue to recite the rosary. But this time to also learn to read. Again, she asked, "I wish you to come here the 13th of each succeeding month".

The third Apparition, July 13th, 1917, Our Lady Still did not reveal herself to the (3) children. Again, requested the children to recite the rosary to obtain world peace and the end of the war. Our Lady also requested the say at the end of each decade, "Oh my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, and lead all souls to Heaven, especially those in most need of Your Mercy."
