"COME AFTER ME, AND I WILL MAKE YOU FISHERS OF MEN."

Matthew 4:19

Today's Gospel from Matthew sketches the initial movements of Jesus' public ministry. The arrest of John the Baptist signals that Jesus' time has come. His first actions include the call of his first disciples, and proclaiming the reign, or kingdom, of heaven. Jesus first gathers a community, which he can gradually form to become living evidence of this coming reign. His preaching, which begins just a few verses later in the Sermon on the Mount, is not just essential guidance for each individual life, but for life within a community of his followers.

It can be very challenging for most of us, who live in a highly individualized society, to hear this story of being summoned into community, committed to learning together and from each other. Our parishes and Christian communities need to be safe places so that we can open our hearts to each other, learning the Way of Jesus, and sharing this Way with others.

UNITED IN CHRIST

In his letter to the Corinthians, Paul addresses many pastoral issues, and begins with questions of division over leader-

ship. We hear of rival camps of loyalty for various leaders and preachers: Paul himself, Apollo, or Cephas. Paul fears that the community has lost the center of the faith, that is, Christ himself. The community is to be united in mind and purpose under Christ.

Many today experience in a very similar division. Some Christians will in effect say: "I belong to . . . (fill in the name of your favorite preacher, theologian, or leader), and those who don't are not to be trusted." Diversity of thought and background are essential to the vitality of Christian community, but here Paul describes a division that hides the message of Christ. It hides Christ's call to charity and forbearance toward all. This division hides the truth that we are all at the foot of the cross, a cross that reveals our own brokenness and our need for mercy.



2022 CONTRIBUTION REPORTS

The contributions reports have been printed and are ready to be picked up. These reports reflect the offertory envelopes that were used. Any online offertory has been sent to your email. If you used both, envelopes & online, you will receive two separate reports.

Remember: If you have not already please pick up your 2023 offertory envelopes. If you do not see your envelopes or are new, please contact the office.

HELP IS NEEDED. . . You don't have to join any club, attend any meetings, or make phone calls. The Counting Teams at both churches need your help when you fill out envelopes. Here are a few simple rules that we ask you to follow:

- 1. If you missed a week, please just put the missed contribution in one envelope. We do not need all the missed envelopes.
- 2. If you are contributing for more than one thing, i.e., Mass Offering, Special Collection, etc., DO NOT write one check for all these items. This can cause mistakes as we must keep all monies separate (weekly offering, special collection, Mass intentions, etc.) The counters have to divide this money up into each pile and this usually causes a mistake.
- 3. It is not necessary that you put your name on the outside of the envelope—your choice, but it is *extremely important that you write the amount* that you are contributing on the outside of the envelope!

These sound like minor things, but when you are counting money and it must all added up before depositing . . . well you get the idea! One mistake can turn a volunteer's job into a nightmare!
