"But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

Matthew 5:44

When Paul writes "you are the temple of God," note that he uses the plural form of "you." He was speaking about the community at Corinth as a temple. For Paul, a temple is where God dwells. God abides, and is active within, the shared life of the community. Paul speaks at length about the divisions within the Corinthian community. These divisions were seen as a defilement of God's temple.

We encounter divisions in our own Church today, sometimes accompanied by a troubling lack of humility and charity. Often the conflicts revolve around establishing markers of true discipleship, with some emphasizing personal faith and morality, and others emphasizing justice and the Church's social teachings. Perhaps the Spirit, active in the temple of our shared life, points toward Jesus' command "love your enemies." Perhaps we best exhibit discipleship in the charity we extend, and our capacity for dialogue, with those who disagree with us or who are unkind to us.

THE SERMON

Today we conclude the series of Sunday Gospel passages from the Sermon on the Mount, Matthew's chapters 5–7. Having proclaimed the coming of the Kingdom, Jesus extensively described to his new community what life is like in this new realm, and the inner dispositions needed to enter into it. He exposed hidden places of the heart, especially those places that needed to be healed.

The Sermon is a huge challenge for us today. The Sermon pushes against our attempts to compromise what God summons us to be and to do. It challenges our deep desires to see ourselves as virtuous, and to resist God's desire to transform us. It reminds us that we are both loved by God and in need of God's help. As we anticipate the season of Lent, consider prayerfully reading the Sermon as a whole. We are invited to carefully explore our deeper motivations, to allow God to uncover and to heal our fears and our wounds.

About the New Hope Community Center



For decades, the New Hope Community Center ("New Hope") has been a pillar for people experiencing homelessness in Lansing. At the request of the community, Holy Cross Services assumed operations of the facility in 2018. Today, New Hope is one of the region's largest homeless shelters and is the area's only "low-barrier" facility – meaning we eliminate as many barriers as we can to ensure all neighbors have access to emergency shelter.

Every year, New Hope needs nearly \$500,000 in donations to keep the shelter operational. With these funds, New Hope is able to keep families together, offer emergency care and nourishment for children, adults, and veterans experiencing homelessness, and help our unhoused neighbors find permanent housing. Through the 2023 Homeless No More event, New Hope hopes to raise \$400,000 toward its annual fundraising target.



There are several programs that operate within the New Hope Community Center, each serving the greater Lansing community:

Community Kitchen	Serving warm breakfast, lunch, and dinner for anyone in the community who needs help	69,000 Meals Served
Day Center	Offering a warm and safe space to rest, recharge, and access case management	- Wedis Serveu
Emergency Shelter	Providing overnight sheltering for individuals with nowhere to turn	118,000 Bed Nights
Family Sheltering	Ensuring families with children remain together during an episode of homelessness	
Veterans' Housing	Sheltering and supporting veterans experiencing homelessness to transition to permanent housing	100% Veteran success rate



What is this about?

Mysteries of the Rosary is made up of a seven 30-35 minute videos (one video per week) which will focus on the Sorrowful Mysteries. The first video is an introduction to the series. Then each of the five mysteries will have an entire episode dedicated to it. Finally, the last episode will serve as a conclusion to bring the series to a close.

Will we be praying the Rosary?

No. *Mysteries of the Rosary* is a reflective deep dive into each Sorrowful Mystery. It is a great tool which can be used to deepen your understanding and prayer based on each mystery, but the series itself does not pray the Rosary or teach specifically how to pray the Rosary.

Who is this for?

Everyone! Families, single people, younger adults, older adults, and high school aged. Men, this includes *YOU* too. You do not have to know how to say the Rosary to come. If you frequently pray the Rosary, this should be an opportunity to enhance your experience. If you feel the Rosary is not for you, this may very well change your mind! Feel free to invite others.
