Notes from Fr. Anthony



We are just getting started.....

It is hard to believe the title, but it is true, we are just getting started on the list of heresies. We have already talked about 5 different ones in the first and second century alone and this week we are going to look at another from the second century - the Montanist heresy. This heresy is interesting in particular due to the fact that the one who started it - Montanus - was a convert to Christianity.

Sometime between the years 135 and 177 AD, shortly after his conversion, Montanus began traveling among the rural settlements of Asia Minor preaching and giving testimony. He offered a charismatic ministry featuring ecstatic spiritual manifestations and he also claimed to have received a series of direct revelations from the Spirit. He was accompanied by two women named Priscilla and Maximilla and as they went, "the Three," as they were called, spoke in ecstatic trance-like states and urged their followers to fast and pray, so that they might share these personal revelations. His preachings spread from his native Phrygia across the contemporary Christian world, to Africa and Gaul.

The main characteristics of Montanism were: "a belief in continuing revelation, a refusal to compromise with worldly standards, its anti-hierarchical stance against appointed bishops leading the Church, and the practice of ecstatic worship in which its prophets channeled messages from God. The Montanists believed that their founder,

together with the two prophetesses Priscilla and Maximilla, were in special and direct communion with the Holy Spirit in a ministry intended to purify the Church in preparation for the coming of Jesus Christ. Montanus himself claimed to be the Paraclete (return of the Holy Spirit) prophesied in John 14:26." It is pretty clear what the problems are here, basically everything they taught goes against what was handed on from the Scriptures and the Apostles, which makes it even more amazing how quickly Montanism spread. This is one of the main reasons why Tertullian - who was an early Church father - never became a saint. He became a Montanist and from there spiraled even further from the Church. This heresy was so persuasive, that a learned and eloquent defender of Christianity in the second century was taken in by it and ended up dying outside of the Church. That is the ultimate goal and end of all heresy, dving outside of the one Church Christ founded. The pride necessary for that to happen is one of the main vices the devil preys upon when enticing some to become heretics and start these heresies. May we all have the humility necessary for obedience to Christ and His Church on earth.


